A. Codebook for the General Social Survey, 2012

The General Social Survey (GSS) is a public opinion poll that has been regularly conducted by the National Opinion Research Council since 1972. A version of the 2012 GSS is available at the Web site for this text and is used in many of the SPSS demonstrations and in end-of-chapter exercises. Our version of the 2012 GSS includes 49 variables for a randomly selected subsample of about 1500 of the original respondents. This codebook lists each item in the data set. The variable names are those used in the data files. The questions have been reproduced exactly as they were asked (with a few exceptions to conserve space), and the numbers beside each response are the scores recorded in the data file.

The data set includes variables that measure demographic or background characteristics of the respondents, including gender, age, race, religion, and several indicators of socioeconomic status. Also included are items that measure opinion on current and controversial topics such as abortion, capital punishment, and homosexuality.

Most variables in the data set have codes for "missing data." These codes are italicized in the listings below for easy identification. The codes refer to various situations in which the respondent does not or cannot answer the question and are excluded from all statistical operations. The codes are: IAP (the respondent was not asked the question), DK ("Don't know," that is, the respondent didn't have the requested information), and NA ("No answer," that is, the respondent refused to answer).
